### Fundraising Afternoon Teas

What are you going to do in winter? Will you be missing the beauty of your garden? How about joining us for an "over-the-top" afternoon tea? For me beautiful antique porcelain becomes my garden in winter. Combine those lovely old dishes with good food, a warm fire, and garden club friends—and you have an event that you won't forget. The Lyndale Park Garden "Daytime Weeding Group" is going to offer two afternoon teas this winter. We realize that it has become difficult for the club to raise money for our special funds, the Park Garden and the Scholarships. So we are holding two fund-raising tea parties. Wouldn't you rather come to tea than organize a public tour?

TIMES: The teas will be held on two days, Friday, February 13 (a very lucky day) and Sunday, March 15 (the Ides of March!) Both start at 2:30 PM and run to about 5—however, end time is flexible--we will not chase you out. The site for these events will be Kay Wolfe's home. Each day we can accommodate 12 people, 6 seated in the Parlor, and 6 in the Library.

WHAT YOU GET: We are planning a "Five Course" Tea—starting with a Port & Sherry course, moving through three food courses (something substantial—not all sandwiches), and ending with sweets. Tea tasting—different teas served with each course—and talks about the origins of the teas, and info on the tea estates from where they originate will be included. Antique porcelain and sterling flatware will be used throughout. Stories about the history of afternoon tea, the particular porcelain being used, and dates of the antique sterling will also be included. The Daytime Weeding Group will be your chefs and servers.

And all this for only \$40 per person! The full price of the tea will be donated to the two MGCM Designated

Funds whose monies are running so low—the Scholarship Fund and the Lyndale Park Garden Fund. The Weeding Group will donate all the food and beverages.

SIGN UP will be at the Holiday Party Silent Auction, and we will be present then to answer questions. First come, first served. If you cannot make it to the Holiday Party—let me know so I can get your name on one of the lists. Hopefully we won't have a rush on places—if so, bribes will be taken!

Payment will not be needed until about 3 weeks before the event. We will send out formal invitations to those that have signed up, and at that time you must respond and send a check to reserve your spot.

In addition to the trial garden, Robert has been chair of the Arbor Day Committee since 1999. Most of the trees that have been planted for the Arbor Day events have gone into Lyndale Park. And in addition to all this—Robert is on the "Steering Committee" of the Lyndale Park Garden Committee—and shows up for just about every single Saturday work crew!

### END OF THE SEASON FOR THE PARK GARDEN

The "Leaf Cover-Up Day" at the Lyndale Park Garden was held on Saturday Nov. 1. Fourteen club members tossed and moved four truckloads of leaves in order to cover the garden. Adding the leaves in fall helps us get one step ahead in spring—to stifle weed growth and keep in spring rains. The truckloads of leaves are delivered to us from Lakewood Cemetery. One member of the Auxiliary (that is the MEN'S Auxiliary to the MEN's Garden Club) showed up, but wished to remain anonymous lest he get thrown out of the Auxiliary for participating in a gardening event. In case you are not aware—the Auxiliary is composed of non-gardening spouses of club members—and they never allow the word 'horticulture' to pass their lips—let alone be caught holding a rake! 
Hegion led us on a tour of the "Arboretum" of Lyndale Park. Back in 1982, one year after a tornado struck this area of Minneapolis, the MGCM did a replanting of trees in the park. Club member and landscape architect Ray Marshall created a landscape plan for the Arboretum. MGCM planted a Mountain Ash Collection, a Nut Collection--buckeye, hickory, butternut--and a Maple Collection. There was a huge old concolor fir that was topped in the tornado, and assuming it would eventually die, the club planted a small circle of young concolor firs around it. To this day the old fir with its top missing still stands in the circle of younger trees--which are now as tall as it is. Check it out in the photo!

Pageant Hill—which was actually built to accommodate pageants--is directly across the street from our border garden. At the top of the hill stands a large

MGCM Board Meeting Minutes November 4, 2008

The November 4, 2008 Board meeting was called to order by President Larry Larson. All board members and directors were present except for Denise Rust. Board nominee Kay Wolfe and scholarship chairman Kent Petterson were invited to attend.

The Board agreed that in 2009 the meeting programs shall be set by a Program Committee to include Larry Larson, new vice president Don Untiedt and a third unnamed person. President Larry Larson will ask for committee volunteers at the November club meeting. Larry Larson suggested we lower fees paid to guest speakers. Kay Wolfe suggested setting a budget of \$500 for payment to guest speakers for 2009 and try to draw some speakers from the club membership.

Kent Petterson, chair of the Scholarship Committee was invited to attend the board meeting because of expected short falls in the clubs 2009 budget. He gave the Board a brief history of the Scholarship Committee, set up in 1992 to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Men's Garden Club of Minneapolis. He suggested rather than having scholarship funds go into the general fund and then disbursed to scholarships, that a designated scholarship fund be set up so that grant dollars and public tour income go directly into the designated scholarship fund. He believes that we may again this year receive a \$1,000 grant from Northwestern Mutual for scholarships; if the grant is not received the club may have to skip a year to get caught up with funds.

Kay Wolfe suggested that some of the committees might consider fund raising activities to help finance committee work. Her committee was planning to sponsor two formal teas

To help raise funds for the clubs work at the Lyndale Park Garden.

The Board agreed to increase the number of Board meeting to the first Tuesday of every month except July, August and December.

Rookie Member of the Year was voted upon and will be awarded at the December Holiday Party.

Elaine Spiegel updated the Board on the silent auction and Holiday Party preparations.

The meeting was adjourned. The next Board meeting will be January 6, 2009, location to be determined.
